## WU CHI-TSUNG: DUST

SITE GALLERY

Site Gallery presents two interactive installations by the Taiwanese artist and rising star Wu Chi-Tsung. Crystal City 003 and Dust make use of everyday materials, plastic boxes, lights and dust, to create meditative dream worlds, influenced by the rapid development of Taiwan's urban landscapes.

It captures the shadows of tiny dust particles as they spiral around the audience to make a mesmerising abstract projection. The faster you move, the more the dust swirls. This is the first chance for UK audiences to see Dust, which was produced by Site Gallery in 2006 and shown later that year at the Shanghai Biennial.

Every object tells a story. This clock owned by the ill-fated Queen Marie Antoinette survived the turmoil of the French Revolution, ending up in the Music Room at Harewood House. It features in an exhibition of Harewood's exceptional collection of 18th century Sèvres porcelain, highlighting a little known historic link between Yorkshire and France. Work by contemporary artists Dan Scott and Michelle Taylor provides a bridge to the past, and the season is completed by a celebration of the great sculptor Henry Moore.

# THOMAS HOUSEAGO LEEDS ART GALLERY YORKSHIRE SCULPTURE PARK

Yorkshire boasts a unique artistic legacy as the birthplace of Barbara Hepworth and Henry Moore, two of the most important 20th century sculptors. Leeds-born Thomas Houseago (b. 1972) is today one of the most internationally influential sculptors of his generation.

The Yorkshire Sculpture Triangle, a partnership between Henry Moore Institute, Leeds Art Gallery, The Hepworth Wakefield and Yorkshire Sculpture Park, brings two of his sculptures to Yorkshire. A monumental new commission made specifically for the centre of Leeds will stand outside Leeds Art Gallery on The Headrow, while another will be located at Yorkshire Sculpture Park.

With references ranging from Greek mythology, Darth Vader, Moore, Hepworth and the Incredible Hulk, Houseago's giant figures are concerned with volume, gravity and scale. While his work has been shown globally, this is the first major commission of Houseago's work in Yorkshire.

Lost Boy Racer is a quirky comedy-drama with a large dose of cycling wisdom, some off-the-wall bike antics and a love story, of sorts...

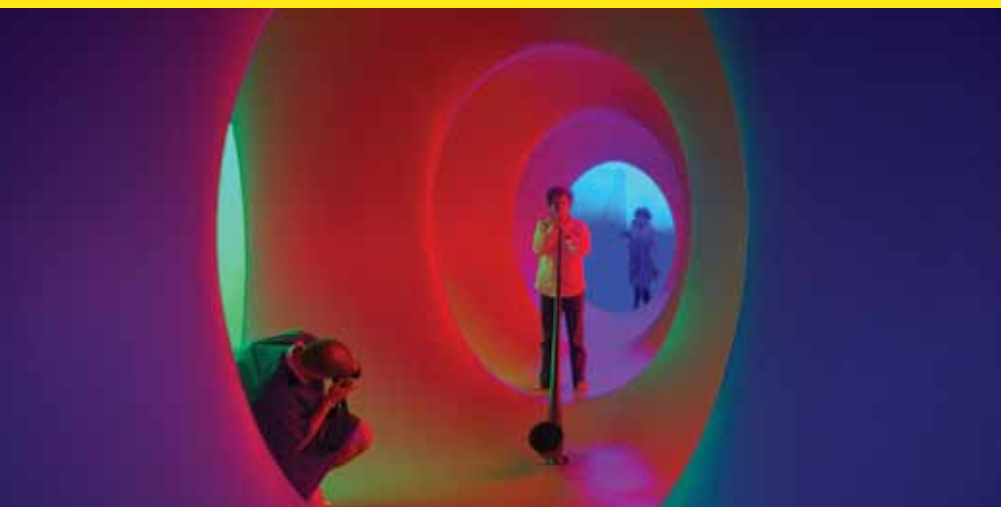

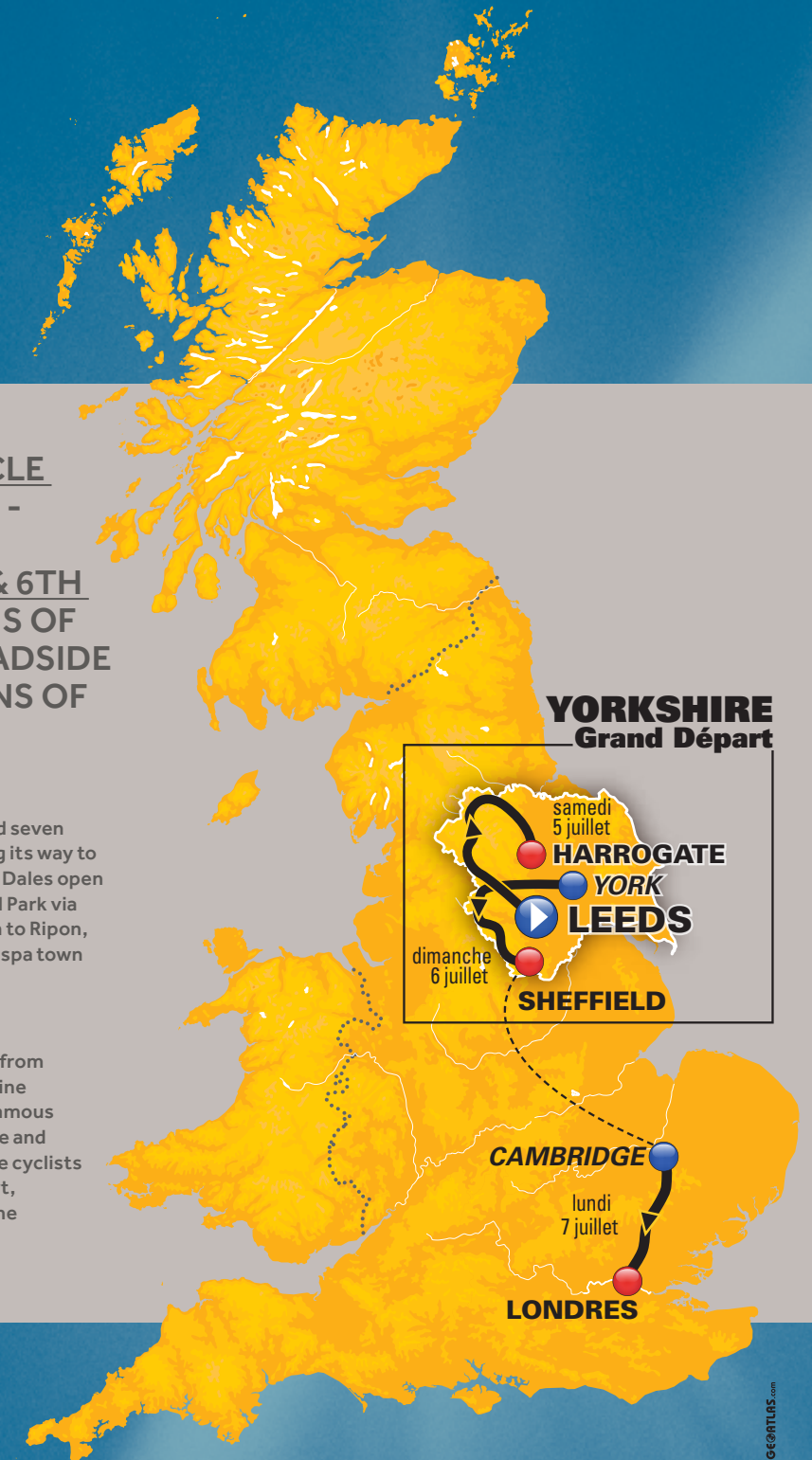
